

## Accreditation Canada – We got it!

Accreditation Canada has awarded the Long-term Care Centre "*Accreditation with Commendation*" which is one level up from last time. We met 94% of an increasing number of standards.

There are three levels of accreditation: Accredited 80 – 84% Accredited with Commendation 85-94% Accredited with Exemplary Standing 95% and above

In order to maintain our accreditation at that level, we have to deal with some standards that were not met, the first by July 6 of this year, and the other four standards a year later. Many staff members are already involved in addressing these areas to maintain our accreditation status.

# Seniors Village Expands with Family Physio



# Changes in Physiotherapy funding

Last month, we reported that the Ministry of Health had made changes to the funding for physiotherapy services for long-term care residents. We have received quite a few questions from residents asking us to provide more details about these changes. Hopefully the following information will help clarify the situation for you.

- For residents needing passive range of motion exercises [who cannot use their hands and feet and need them exercised]. This care will now be provided in other ways [by staff and others] and with the option of private physiotherapy, if desired.
- For residents who are physically independent for walking and transfers, we will be providing more exercise classes but there may be less one-on-one treatment. We are pleased to report that an exercise class has been added to the many classes already provided in the Gatineau 2 North. # Seniors Housing/Assisted Living

Here are answers to recent questions received by Cheryl Homuth. The apartment buildings onsite are almost finished. These buildings contain regular apartments as you might currently live in – bachelor, one bedroom, two bedrooms, and two bedrooms with den. The buildings operate under the *Residential Tenancies Act*, and not Long-Term Care standards. However because one of the buildings is connected to the Long-Term Care centre, **the access points to this apartment** building from the Long-Term Care centre must meet Long-Term Care standards. That is why doors are being installed on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Long-Term Care Centre at the junction where the LTC meets Building A.

A popular misconception is that the apartment building next to Russell Road, Building B, is only for independent tenants. Both buildings contain tenants who utilize Assisted Living services, and tenants who do not require these services.

Resident Care Liaisons provide ongoing support, counselling, education, and advocacy for our residents, family members and staff. They work to resolve problems related to institutional living and often assist residents, families, Powers of Attorneys, SDMs and Guardians in working through legal, financial, and basic care issues.

Carolyn comes to us from our Assisted Living Program with nine years of planning, coordinating, and managing issues, programs, and activities involving seniors and the elderly in the Ottawa area. Her past roles have encompassed case management, recreational programming, community support and outreach, assisted living services and tenant relations.

Carolyn's office is located on O2W at the main communication station, her extension is 2353. Carolyn will be focusing her work on O2E, O2W, O1W, G1N, G2N and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of O1E.

# Employee Education -New Laptops

A purchase of 16 new laptops on wheeled carts has been made with special monies made available from the MOHLTC dedicated for education purposes for staff working in long-term care. Lack of access to computer equipment was identified as a key roadblock for staff. Each home unit, support services, and all three REC/CAS offices will receive a laptop on wheels.

# Students – A Welcome Addition to Perley Rideau

Perley Rideau offers opportunities for growth and education to young people interested in working with seniors who come to learn and gain practical experience. The student program is coordinated by Ursula Lamoureux and Carolyn Vollicks.

We accept students from seven schools in the region, encompassing fields of study and occupations such as dance therapy, dental hygiene, gerontology, massage therapy, medical students, music therapy, occupational therapy and aids, recreation therapy for RN and RPN, personal support worker, and social work student.

In 2013, we had 253 students completing 16,521.5 hours of placement time. All are supervised by Perley Rideau staff who take the time to pass on their experience and knowledge and who support this wonderful learning opportunity. Numerous students who have completed their placement here *return to us as valued employees*.

# Children's "Panomurals" Coming to the MET Gallery


