Energy and Facility Renewal Program at the Health Centre

Energy is one of the largest operating expenses at Perley Rideau. That's why the Health Centre developed a program with Honeywell to save energy and operating costs and at the same time reduce our environmental footprint.

Phase one of the program, which includes the following, is now complete.

Building Envelope:

All exterior doors have been weather-sealed to help reduce drafts and improve comfort.

Water Conservation:

We have replaced 550 toilets and washroom fixtures with low flow type models which will reduce our water costs by 1/3. Our water usage will drop by close to 21,000 m³, enough water to fill approximately 8.3 Olympic size pools.

Lighting Systems:

Over 5,500 lighting fixtures, lamps and ballasts (electronic device) were replaced with new generation high efficiency models throughout the facilities. The new lighting systems and controls will reduce the amount of electricity required.

Building Automation:

The building automation system was upgraded to include more efficient control of heating, cooling and ventilation systems.

Central Heating and Cooling Plant:

The new central heating and cooling plant located between the Gatineau Link and the Perley Centre has been installed to improve our heating and cooling reliability while reducing operating costs. Windows have been installed on both floors of the Link to allow residents, staff and visitors a view of the new plant in operation.

We are now working on the second phase of the program which includes:

Air flow:

Currently, the systems are being optimized so that the air flow closely matches the building occupancy needs for maximum comfort.



Solar Panels: 1,200 solar panels that will generate over 300 MWh of electricity per year, enough to

power 27 average households will be installed on 3 of the 4 roof tops this summer (excluding Rideau Residence).

The overall cost is \$6.6 million. The annual savings are estimated at \$600,000 in utility and operational costs resulting in a payback of 11 years and a simple return of 9% on the investment. These improvements will also lower our carbon dioxide emission by 320 metric tonnes annually – equivalent to removing 53 medium size cars from the road each year.

The dental hygiene services that Muriel provides at the Perley Rideau clinic include: complete oral assessments, tartar and stain removal, individualized oral hygiene information and provision of the tools needed for good plaque removal, desensitization, fluoride treatments to prevent decay, teeth whitening or bleaching, fissure sealants, custom mouth guards, and referrals to dentists and specialists.

In the presentations that were given at PRVHC from November through the end of January, we learned how good oral health is important if good overall health is desired. As April is oral health month, let's all work together to ensure our residents are getting the best oral care possible. By understanding the role of plaque in disease, we can better do this! Veteran's Affairs has provided more funds to allow Muriel to continue working with residents and teaching in the next few months.

Communications Activities

The FFC encourages families to support the restorative care program. The FFC will celebrate the province-wide Family Council Week June 8-14, 2013, with an invited guest speaker on Wednesday, June 11. Detective **Isabelle Coady of the Ottawa Police** will address elder abuse issues. The time and the location of the presentation will be confirmed. Physiotherapy Funding Changes Announced

The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care has announced changes to OHIPfunded physiotherapy services. Effective Aug.1, 2013, access to physiotherapy and exercise and falls prevention classes for seniors will be directly funded through Long-Term Care Homes, Community Health Centres and other locations. Currently, physiotherapy services provided at Perley Rideau are directly billed to OHIP by our physiotherapy provider.

The impact of the Ministry's announcement on physiotherapy services in Long-Term Care is unclear. Perley Rideau is working with our physiotherapy provider, Family Physio, to determine how these changes will be implemented for our residents. We remain committed to providing the highest level of care possible within the funding available. We will communicate further once we have assessed the changes that may come into effect on Aug. 1st.
