Seniors Village Becoming a Reality at Perley Rideau

On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, Premier Kathleen Wynne travelled to Ottawa to officially open 45 of the new apartments specially-designed for seniors and to celebrate significant milestones in the creation of the Perley Rideau Seniors Village. These milestones include the extension of Assisted Living Services, expansion of the Adult Day and the convalescent care programs, the full accreditation by Accreditation Canada for 2011 – 2014 and the maintenance of our resident satisfaction survey results at 86%.



On hand for the celebration were **Premier Kathleen Wynne**, other dignitaries from all levels of government, health care partners, donors, key contractors, and many others that are helping build the Perley

Rideau Seniors Village. Also, attending were Board Members and senior Staff from both the Health Centre and Foundation. More than 175 guests attended the event. The day started with an early tour by Premier Wynne of Building A, led by **Greg Fougere** and **Janet Page from CBRE.**



After the tour, Premier Wynne joined the other invitees who had gathered in the Cafeteria. **Mike Jeffery** and **Peter Strum**, Chair and immediate Past Chair of the Health Centre Board made some introductory remarks, welcoming guests and outlining our accomplishments and priorities for the future including a Seniors Primary Care Clinic and Wellness Centre. Mike Jeffery recommended our recently released Report to the Community for more details. Employees, friends, and family can access this report via our website www.perleyrideau.ca.

Premier Wynne then made her address and had some very positive remarks about

Perley Rideau, and was very supportive of our actions and plans.

In the words of Premier Wynne: "The Centre has recognized the real needs of seniors and has come up with a real plan to address those needs! It is truly the kind of model we need to be duplicating and replicating across the province."

Further remarks by **Alice Wong**, the Canadian federal Minister of State for Seniors, and **Jim Watson**, Mayor of Ottawa, echoed these sentiments. Finally, our own **Grete Hale**, Honorary Co-Chair of the *Building Choices, Enriching Lives* Capital Campaign, spoke from the heart about her vision for seniors and what Perley Rideau could do to help and Perley Rideau's need for donations to complete the \$5 million fundraising target. The Foundation was well represented by **Ray Desjardins**, **Dan Clapin**, and many other Board members.

The formalities in Lupton Hall were followed by a ribbon-cutting ceremony in front of Building B; dignitaries were joined by many of our new tenants.



In the meantime, the rest of the guests followed a bagpiper to Lupton Hall where refreshments were served and the new video on the Perley Rideau Seniors Village was shown. The video was a hit! The feedback we received was very positive; all of our stakeholders were very impressed by our progress and achievements in the last year. We should all be very proud!

strategic planning, change management and defense and security issues. In October 2011, Lieutenant-General Jeffery assumed the honorary appointment of Colonel Commandant, The Royal


Regiment of Canadian Artillery Campaign.



The Vital Signs Project was initiated in January with the PSWs from all three shifts on Gatineau 2 North. The goal was to teach PSWs how to take vital signs such as blood pressure, pulse, respirations, temperatures and oxygen levels.

This project has given PSWs more skilled responsibilities, other than direct resident care and conforms to the current level of practice for a PSW in Ontario.
