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Seniors Village -Another major step forward!

Although there are still some finishing touches to add, tenants are quickly moving into their new homes in our second apartment building, which is adjacent to the Perley Centre.

Occupancy is currently at 50% in Building A and 85% in Building B.

Overall occupancy by former Canadian Forces personnel is 46% as compared to 54% by seniors from the community.

We now have a waiting list for studio and two-bedroom apartments. The only remaining vacancies are for one bedroom apartments.

Assisted Living Services (ALS) are being extended to these new tenants in need. ALS as you know is already provided to seniors in need, who choose to live at home, supported by a variety of on-site programs like the Adult Day program, Guest House, and convalescent care beds.

Our new main entrance is now open which leads to the expanded area for health-oriented services that is also a key component to building our Seniors Village. Family Physio is scheduled to be operational in November with other services to follow in December.

This Broadening of the Spectrum of Care, anchored by our core long-term care programs, makes our Seniors Village a unique hub for seniors in the community.

We congratulate all those who have been very busy getting the new apartments ready, the services up and running, and welcoming the new tenants. An open house for employees and volunteers is being planned as soon as staff can catch their breaths.

The overall capital cost of the project is \$44 million. This major commitment by Perley Rideau was necessary to remain relevant to the changing needs of the community and for us to be sustainable over the long term.

The Foundation through its *Building Choices*, *Enriching* Lives capital campaign is working hard to raise \$5 million to help defray the capital costs.

I still remember my first shift at the Perley (Aylmer Avenue in 1983) when I declared on my way home I would never work at this place. Now a short 30 years later I am leaving, what has been an enjoyable period in my life, with high expectations for the next. Working here and all that has resulted from it will look great on a resume if I need one.

At the old Perley, RVH, and here I have benefited from working with some great PSWs. I remember waltzing in the hall on third floor with Daphne on the night shift, and when Thelma and Dixy tried to get me to make my beds to their standards. They finally gave up and just made them for me.
