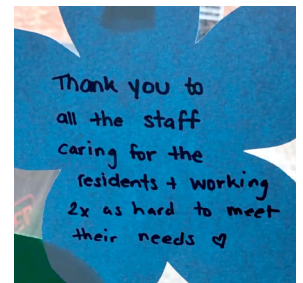
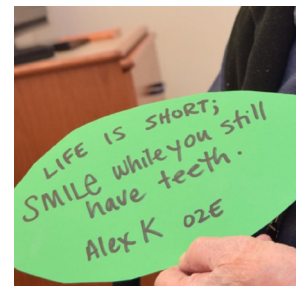
The Perley and Rideau Veterans' Health Centre continues to do everything possible to protect the health of our residents and staff. Access to the Health Centre is restricted to staff and residents, for instance, and even they have to pass screening tests to enter the building. Our goal is simple: keep the virus from spreading while maximizing residents' quality of life. Our success so far results directly from the outstanding efforts of staff – men and women who are showing remarkable dedication and professionalism during this crisis – and the cooperation of our residents and their families.

Staff also continue to come up with new ways to protect health and maximize quality of life.

A good example is Virtual Visits: Using iPads and tablet computers, a group of staff known as the Skype Team arranges video chats between residents of the Health Centre and their families. For residents who are not comfortable with digital technologies and don't have telephones in their rooms, the Team also arranges phone calls. An average of 250 Virtual Visits take place each week. Another popular new project is known as the Garden of Gratitude. The Therapeutic Recreation and Creative Arts team painted a mural of colourful flowers on the inside of the cafeteria window.
