A caregiver is a type of essential visitor who is designated by the resident and/or their substitute decision-maker and is visiting to provide direct care to the resident (e.g., supporting feeding, mobility, personal hygiene, cognitive stimulation, communication, meaningful connection, relational continuity, and assistance in decision-making).¹ Examples of caregivers include family members, a privately hired caregiver, paid companions, and translators.

Guidelines

- 1. Caregivers will present to the Support Services office for a badge/photo ID to be created (View map, CLICK HERE). There is a \$5 charge for the creation of the badge/photo ID.
- 2. Caregivers must receive a COVID-19 rapid swab test at the Perley Health as frequently as directed by the Ministry of Health. The tests are required at the on-site clinic. All caregivers must wait the required duration for results before leaving the clinic.
- 3. Caregivers must attest that within the last 14 days, they have not visited another resident who is in self-isolation or symptomatic and/or a home on outbreak.
- 4. Caregivers must attest that they have read the Visitor Policy.
