Since its creation 25 years ago through the amalgamation of The Perley Hospital, The Rideau Veterans Home and the Veterans wing of the National Defence Medical Centre, Perley Health has continuously evolved to meet the needs of the people it serves. This includes expanding its services and programs to welcome and care for more Veterans — a long-standing tradition.

Key to this future is continuing to provide exceptional care to veterans, Hoffer notes, something Perley Health has always done, thanks in part to the support of Veterans Affairs Canada, the Royal Canadian Legion, Commissionaires Ottawa and members of the public.

This commitment is evident in the decision to create a new, secure unit for Veterans within the Rideau Veterans Residence, an LTC building recently renamed and assigned to house Veterans residing at Perley Health.

Perley Health's Applied Research Priorities Focus on Individualized Care and the Psychosocial Impacts of the Pandemic on Residents

The organization's long-term transformation has been underway since 2010, with major growth in their service offerings evolving over recent years and leading up to this rebrand. One of the most pertinent examples of growth and focus on innovation was the launch of Perley Health Centre for Excellence in Frailty-Informed Care™ (CoE), which conducts applied research and identifies, develops and shares best practices in the care of older adults living with frailty at Perley Health and the wider community as well.

One of the CoE's recent initiatives and focus of ongoing research is SeeMe[™], a frailty assessment and management framework that takes a holistic, individualized approach

to care. The CoE is also investigating the psychosocial impacts of COVID-19 restrictions and exploring the benefits of intergenerational visits between university students and residents living with dementia.

"The pandemic restrictions have shown how detrimental social isolation can be to seniors," said **Dr. Annie Robitaille, Commissionaires Ottawa Research Chair of the Perley Health CoE and Assistant Professor in the Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences at the University of Ottawa.** "It really brings to light how critical it is that they remain engaged mentally and physically."

Perley Health is a unique centre for applied research, education, and clinical and therapeutic services that empowers Seniors and Veterans to live life to the fullest in an environment they are proud to call home.
