


Construction Updates

Centre of Excellence Update

The Perley Health Centre of Excellence in Frailty-Informed Care™ will play a pivotal role in researching and supporting the new intergenerational child care program. As a unique environment that brings generations together, Perley Health is ideally positioned to implement, evaluate and adapt this innovative program.



The research of the Centre of Excellence addresses the impact of social isolation on individuals living with frailty, a challenge highlighted by the recent pandemic. While evidence suggests that intergenerational connections can reduce loneliness and improve quality of life, this program offers a unique opportunity to study these effects within a long-term care setting. The Centre of Excellence will take a structured approach to evaluate facility design, individual participation, engagement, and outcomes related to loneliness, mood and overall well-being for seniors and Veterans. For the children attending the program, research can be conducted examining empathy, confidence, and social awareness.

By applying a frailty-informed care lens, the Centre of Excellence ensures that the program is safe, meaningful, and tailored to the unique needs of older adults and children. This research is crucial for informing policymakers and health leaders on new opportunities. Ultimately, the goal is to share these lessons and provide practical tools and a forward-looking blueprint for others to adopt and adapt this model of care and engagement.
